As part of a Heritage Project supported by the National Lottery, students have been learning about the history of the church building and items based in the church. Students were keen to offer their support so, utilising their independent living skills, they helped with cleaning the building.







Friends of St Johns, Jo Slade spoke the students about the Church Spire appeal. This information was shared with College Ambassadors who led a vote for all students who unanimously agreed to donate to this appeal. Students are thrilled to support and help another local charity. Students had the opportunity to see specialist digital imagery equipment in action, curtesy of a team from the University of Wolverhampton. The drone robots that have been used to scan the building fascinated all of them!

#### **Sign of the Half Term**

Students have chosen 'Independent' as their sign of the term.

They have chosen this as they have been working hard in their independent living skills session, being more independent making their own lunch and making their own decisions.





Students have also been working towards their Signalong qualification and are learning new signs on a weekly basis.

This half term, Explorers students have been developing their communication skills through sessions with Speech and Language Therapists, Claire and Chloe.

During these sessions, students have communicated their preferences for exploring sensory stimuli.






Students have also been taking part in a Sensory Story called 'The Hair Salon'. The story gave students an experience of what it might be like to work in a Hair Salon.

They practiced appropriate greetings, used their senses to smell different products, combed hair and made choices of how to style their own hair.

Explorers students have enjoyed listening to the sounds of nature, gentle yoga and dancing round the Maypole.





## **Independent Living Skills**

#### **Cooking**



Students have been busy cooking and making balanced food choices during Independent Living Skills lessons. These lessons have been very successful and have incorporated Maths and Thinking skills, Communication and Hand Function skills.

Students worked together to prepare a meal that they can all enjoy, they chose a lunch that they all were happy with, shopped for the ingredients then prepared the lunch on a Tuesday morning.





# **Explorers Maths & Thinking Skills**

During Maths and Thinking Skills sessions, students have been further practicing the use of switches to control their environments and entertainment.





As our end of term play will be the 'Wizard of Oz', they have been watching the original movie and using a switch to advance to the next scene.

Students have also done some work on the Soundbeam around the very famous "Somewhere over the Rainbow" song, with the hopes of recording their very own version of it.

We also set up the green screen and started filming some scenes for the big production.


# **Enrichment Day**
