




Our raffle and tombola had wonderful prizes that had been generously donated to us from local companies, staff and students' family members.

This term the students have been taking part in a sensory story about a day at the beach.

Students had also been practising using Signalong for the film and performed an incredible rendition of 'Somewhere over the Rainbow' through the Soundbeam (see overleaf).






This project has helped us explore themes of friendship and self-belief just like the story of The Wizard of Oz! The end result was phenomenal and even brought tears of happiness to many an eye!
